Senate Probers'

Slap at FBI

Document Delay

Washington

Declaring its investigation of FBI abuses had been "severely hampered," a Senate committee yesterday called on FBI director Clarence M. Kelley and Attorney General Edward Levi to explain why they had failed to produce documents requested two months ago.

The Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Activities said the Justice Department and the FBI, over which the department has jurisdiction, had failed to turn over documents concerning allegations of FBI burglaries, political abuses and other irregularities.

In a letter to Levi, the committee asked that he and Kelley appear before it in executive session next week to discuss the matter.
