

SCHWEICKER SEEKS INQUIRY ON KENNEDY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 7 (AP) — Senator Richard S. Schweicker, Republican of Pennsylvania, is seeking to have the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence take a new look at the assassination of President Kennedy.

An aide to the Senator confirmed the plan today, and U. S. News & World Report quoted Mr. Schweicker as saying: "Up until a few months ago I was one who believed the Warren Commission's conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald had acted alone. But all these new developments have caused me to question some of the commission assumptions. To me it's like a big, public boil that's going to burst."

Senator Schweicker is sponsoring a resolution calling on the Senate panel, which has been investigating the nation's intelligence agencies, to look into the Kennedy slaying. Senator Schweicker is a member of the committee.
