

More Disclosures by Kennedy Friend Promised

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Dec. 19 (UPI)—Judith Campbell Exner's attorney says that a book or television presentation will disclose more about her relationship with President Kennedy.

"We're looking at all alternatives," the attorney, Brian Monaghan, said yesterday. "We want the story told right. It may be a book, or series of articles or television interview, but it certainly is not going to be further news conferences."

Mrs. Exner, now the wife of the professional golfer, Dan Exner, emerged from 15 years of obscurity when information about her life was related in Senate committee testimony about C.I.A. assassination plots. She told a news conference Wednesday that she had a personal relationship with two Mafia figures at the same time she was seeing the late President.

But she never discussed her relationship with Mr. Kennedy when seeing the Chicago Mafia chief Sam Giancana and his associate John Rosselli, she told reporters.

Mr. Monaghan said that Mrs.

Exner talked with representatives of CBS' "60 Minutes" program after the news conference.

A spokesman for George Hoover, executive producer of information services for CBS in New York, said that "60 Minutes" representatives were not bidding for the story.

"No money will ever be put up for this," he said.

Mrs. Exner denied having been unsuccessful in earlier attempts to sell a book or that she was interested in writing one or looking for an agent. But she said that she had sought Mr. Monaghan's advice

after at least one offer to buy the rights to her story.

Mr. Monaghan said that she had related her experiences in a series of tape recordings.
