

JFK 'Friend'

Tries for \$2 Million

Mystery woman Judith Campbell Exner, who created a stir by claiming personal links to John F. Kennedy and two Mafia kingpins, is trying to sell her "memoirs" for an estimated \$2 million, the Los Angeles Times learned yesterday.

The artist retained literary agent Scott Meredith after her San Diego attorney, Brian Moneghan, was unsuccessful in several attempts to place the proposed book with New York publishers.

Mrs. Exner, 41, said her relationship with the late President was "of a close, personal nature" during the 13 or 14 months she said they saw each other after they were reportedly introduced by singer Frank Sinatra Feb. 7, 1969, in Las Vegas.

She also disclosed her personal relationships with underworld figures Sam (Momo) Giancana, slain Chicago mobster, and his protege, John Rosselli, but denied having any knowledge of CIA-Mafia plots to assassinate Cuban Premier Fidel Castro.
