

### C.I.A. Agrees to Restrict Its Use of Missionaries

WASHINGTON, June 7 (UPI)—The Central Intelligence Agency has agreed not to seek intelligence information from United States missionaries stationed abroad but many continue to approach such missionaries in the United States, according to the agency's director, George Bush.

Mr. Bush, in a series of letters and meetings with Senator Mark O. Hatfield, Republican of Oregon, has agreed to expand the definition of missionary to include all Americans abroad who are performing tasks involving preaching, teaching, healing and proselytizing, even if they are not technically controlled by denominational or ecumenical groups "provided their ultimate sponsorship comes from religious organizations."
