reported yesterday." He added, however, that the prognosis remains guarded.

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The next report on the senator's condition will be issued at 2 p.m., CST, today.

Stennis, chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, was wounded in the chest and thigh Jan. 30 during a holdup in front of his home. Police are seeking a number of youths in the case.

The hospital spokesman added: "The physicians are satisfied with his progress, he has been moved from the surgical intensive care unit and is receiving intensive care in a private room."
