Guilty Plea In Stennis Shooting

Washington

One of three men accused of shooting and robbing Senator John C. Stennis (Dem-Miss.) pleaded guilty yesterday before U.S. District Judge Joseph C. Waddy.

John S. Marshall, 21, pleaded guilty of assault with intent to kill a member of Congress, armed robbery, assault with intent to kill while armed and carrying a pistol without a license. He made the plea without acknowledging fault, a procuedure approved for youths several years ago by the Supreme Court.

Marshall's lawyer said he pleaded guilty because he will be 22 soon and can now take advantage of the D.C. Youth Corrections Act, which often means a lesser sentence and future expungement of his record.

Still to be tried in the case are Marshall's brother, Tyrone, 18, and Derrick-R. Holloway, 19. Stennis, chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, was robbed at gunpoint January 30. He now is recuperating at his home in Mississippi.
