Assailant Is Sentenced

One of three men charged with shooting and robbing Senator John C. Stennis was sentenced yesterday to three concurrent 10-to-30 year prison terms.

Tyrone I. Marshall, 19, received an additional oneyear sentence for carrying a deadly weapon.

The maximum sentence on the charges could have been life imprisonment.

After U.S. District Court Judge Joseph C. Waddy announced the sentence Marshall said, "I'm not going to accept that sentence, your honor. I ain't going to accept that."

Marshall had to be forcibly removed from the courtroom by marshals. As Marshall reached the door, he attempted to strike one of the marshals.

Waddy rejected a defense plea to sentence Marshall as a juvenile.

Marshall abruptly ended his trial last October by entering a guilty plea in the Jan. 30, 1973
