ANN ARBOR, Mich.—The Veterans Administration hospital here was to resume normal operations today after a 24-day disruption caused by an FBI murder investigation.

Hospital administrators decided last week to drop strict security precautions imposed in the wake of an outbreak or respiratory failures that killed at least nine patients.

The FBI said yesterday it will continue its investigation, but will withdraw some agents from the hospital and reduce the amount of time spent on the case.

Hospital administrators say some patients apparently were deliberately injected with the paralyzing drug Pavulon.

The injections, doctors say, caused more than 50 respiratory failures between July 1 and Aug. 15. Eleven patients have died at the facility, but officials said the cause of death in two cases apparently was not respiratory failure.
