Will Do

Former Pennsylvania Governor William Scranton has agreed to a request from President Ford to continue his work on reorganizing the White House staff, a presidential spokesman said yesterday.

Jerald F. terHorst, White House press secretary, told reporters that "the President wants Scranton available for additional consultation." He said Scranton would act as a "talent scout" for Mr. Ford.

Scranton was a member of the transition team which has recommended ways the White House operation can be restructured to suit Mr. Ford's working habits and to provide a "comfortable mechanism," terHorst said.

But Mr. Ford has not yet made any final decision on how he intends to structure his staff.

Scranton himself has taken himself out of consideration for any key position in

the Ford Administration, terHorst said.
