

Haig Vague, Pays Bill

BRUSSELS Jan. 29 (UPI)—Gen. Alexander M. Haig Jr. brought along cases of vodka and wine incorrectly labeled "glassware," in possible violation of U.S. Army rules, when he became commander of allied forces in Europe, Army officials said today.

Haig's executive officer, Brig. Gen. Joseph Bratton, confirmed the incident.

But Bratton said Haig had acted "innocently and inadvertently" and had already written a check for \$91 to repay the Army for the liquor shipment.

Bratton said the incident was a combination of a labeling mistake by packers in Washington and confusion over whether Haig had the right to ship the liquor at all.

A week ago, Haig was accused by Rep. Les Aspin (R-Wis.) of illegally ordering an Army staff car to transport his dog from Frankfurt to Stuttgart. Haig agreed to pay the government \$46.92 for the 260-mile round trip by two enlisted men in the Army car.
