Poll Shows Ford's Popularity Soared

President Ford's popularity rating has risen dramatically, with 51 per cent in the latest survey now voicing approval of his performance in office.

This gain of 11 percentage This gain of it percentage points since the previous survey in early May represents one of the sharpest gain ever recorded in Gallup surveys going back to the middle 1930s the middle 1930s.

The President's latest rat-

ing was based on a survey conducted following the Mayaguez incident and the first leg of Mr. Ford's recent European trip. It may also reflect, in part, an upturn in public optimism regarding the economy.

The sharpest gain in popularity ever recorded in the nearly four decades of such measurements was President Nixon's 17-point gain in approval following the Vietnam peace settlement in

late January 1973.

President Johnson's popularity rating shot up 13 points following his a n-nouncement in March 1968 of a cessation of bombing in North Vietnam. President Kennedy's popularity also climbed 13 points — in a survey conducted shortly after the Cuban missile crisis in the fall of 1962.

Following is the question asked to measure presidential popularity:

"Do you approve or disapprove of the way (name of incumbent) is handling his job as president?"

Here are the results of the latest survey, compared with those recorded in the previous (early May) surv-

Approve ...40%
Disapprove ...43
No opinion ...17

President Ford's gains in popularity between the two surveys have come "across the board." One of the most pronounced changes has come about among men. In the early May survey, men and women gave Mr. Ford closely comparable ratings, but in the latest survey, men are more inclined to approve than are women.
