Ford Ban on News Of Social Events Protested by Press added.

WASHINGTON, July 16 (UPI)
—Four major news organizations protested to President Ford today over his policy of banning coverage of White House social receptions.

In a letter to Mr. Ford, the White House Correspondents Association, the Washington Press Club, the National Press Club and the Society for Professional Journalists (Sigma Delta Chi) said that all had taken action through their executive boards or general membership to urge the President to rescind the ban.

The policy, imposed May 9, changed a 20-year practice of allowing reporters to cover Presidential social activities paid for with Covernment funds that were deeply concerned by the erosion of coverage of social events at the White House
