## Aspin Puts U.S. Arms Sales In 2 Years at \$20.3-Billion

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 (UPI)

— Representative Les Aspin,
Democrat of Wisconsin, said
today that the United States'
foreign military sales during
the last two fiscal years totoled "an incredible \$20.3-billion," or \$3-billion higher than
previously reported by the Pentagon.

The Pertagon said that \$2.4-billion of that figure was attributable to a bookkkeeping change involving construction projects in the Middle East.

"The Pentagon is very belatedly increasing its figures on foreign military sales," Mr. Aspin said in a letter to Lieut. Gen. Howard M. Fish, director of the Defense Security Assistance Agency. "Why did it take the Pentagon so long to report this dramatic increase?"
