

Nomination of Rockefeller

Opposed in Harris Survey

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11 (UPI)—One out of four Republicans say they will not vote for their party's Presidential nominee in 1976 if Vice President Rockefeller is in the No. 2 spot on the G.O.P. ticket, Louis Harris, the pollster, reported today.

Mr. Harris said that his latest survey showed the American public in general opposes Mr. Rockefeller's nomination by a 47 to 34 per cent margin.

He said the Vice President's strongest support was among rank-and-file Republicans, who favor his being named on the ticket by 43 to 42 per cent. However, by 44 to 35 per cent, independent voters are against a Rockefeller nomination, Mr. Harris said.
