

Agents "Cleared" Her

Sara Jane Moore, held yesterday for attempting to assassinate President Ford, was examined by Secret Service agents Sunday afternoon as a "potential threat" to the President and was cleared after questioning.

Shortly thereafter, acting on information that Miss Moore might be a danger to Mr. Ford, two San Francisco police officers went to her home at 565 Guerrero street.

When she drove up in her car at about 2:30 p.m., the officers asked if she had a gun in her

possession. They found a .44-caliber special pistol and 13 live rounds of ammunition in the bottom of her handbag.

Police also know Miss Moore as Sara Jane Aalberg.

The officers said in their report that they searched her automobile and found two boxes of .44-caliber bullets in the glove compartment.

Miss Moore was taken to Mission Station and cited for having a concealed weapon on her person.

With Miss Moore at the station, the report said, was a blonde woman, about 25 years of age, five feet six inches tall and weighing 120 pounds. She was asked for her handbag, which was also searched, and no weapon was found. The woman was not identified.

Miss Moore was cited to appear in court October 8 on the gun charge. There was no explanation as to why her home was not searched.

The Secret Service had no comment on its clearance of Miss Moore.
