

**Kissinger's Rating Up
In Latest Harris Poll**

With a 63 per cent positive job-rating from the American people, Secretary of State Kissenger "now evokes more confidence from the public than any other member of the Ford Administration, including the President," the Harris Poll says.

"Specifically, on the key dimension of 'working to achieve a lasting peace in the Middle East,' Kissinger's standing has risen from only 48 per cent positive last May to a current 61 per cent positive," the poll concluded on the basis of a survey of 1,497 adults.

In May, 1974, Mr. Kissinger's job rating was 85 to 10 per cent positive, but by last May, this rating had slipped to 56 to 37 positive. The poll said that the 63-to-31-positive results of the latest inquiry, made in September, "signal a turnaround in the Secretary of State's popularity after a long slide."
