WASHINGTON, Nov. 28—The
State Department denied a report today from Panama alleging that Brig. Gen. Omar Torrijos Herrera and handed American negotiators a note protesting agains the United States
position on a new Panama Canal treaty.

A news agency report said
that General Torrijos, the head
of the Panamanian Government, had given such a note
to ambassador Ellsworth Bunker, the chief American negotiator, on Wednesday at the

A State Department spokesman said: "we do not understand the report Our negotiators were given no message

round."
