

KISSINGER ASSAILED**BY ZUMWALT ANEW**

Adm. Elmo R. Zumwalt Jr., retired Chief of Naval Operations and a potential opponent of Senator Harry F. Byrd Jr. of Virginia for the Democratic nomination for the Senate, yesterday demanded the dismissal of Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger.

"It should be done in such a way that it shouldn't be possible for it to be fuzzed up by his resigning," Admiral Zumwalt said. "He should be fired."

Long a foe of both Mr. Kis-

singer and the policy of détente with the Soviet Union, Admiral Zumwalt charged the Secretary with repeatedly deceiving Congress and the American people on the number and the seriousness of Soviet violations of arms limitation agreements.

Speaking before the Rotary Club of New York at the Commodore Hotel, Admiral Zumwalt said:

"Key decisions relating to the survival of the country over the long run are too important to be left to the judgment of a single assistant to the President, no matter how clever he may be."
