Anne Armstrong Is Confirmed

The Senate confirmed Anne L. Armstrong unanimously yesterday as the nation's first woman Ambassador to Britain and Northern Ireland. The action was by voice vote after Senator Mike Mansfield of Montana, the Democratic majority leader, spoke to commend President Ford for "an excellent appointment."

The former Republican National Committee co-chairman and White House counselor said she expected to present herself at the Court of St. James's in late February or early March after briefings by the State Department. Her husband, Tobin, a Texas rancher and business executive, will go with her to London.
