

A Top Kissinger Aide Quits

Washington

Joseph Sisco, undersecretary of state for political affairs and one of Henry-Kissinger's top advisers, is resigning his job to become president of American University here.

The move was announced yesterday in letters exchanged by Sisco and

President Ford.

Sisco has been Secretary of State Kissinger's adviser on Middle East problems while holding the third-ranked job at the State Department.

Sisco asked that his resignation take effect in July.
