Dallas, Tex., Feb. 24 (AP)- Dist Atty Henry Wade said today he has believed all along that "someone might have encouraged or aided" the Harvey Oswald in killing President John F. Kennedy.

Wade said he ~~was~~ told as much to the Warren Commission and reiterated he has "absolutely no evidence" to refute the commission's finding that the weight of evidence showed Oswald acted alone.

Wade said he knew nothing of New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's current investigation into the assassination. Garrison has said he has solved the assassination and will make arrests.

"It seemed a little complicated for Oswald to figure out alone, and he did have a lot of Castro literature on him. He had to plan this pretty well, learn the route and learn to be in one certain place," Wade said of the assassination.

Wade said he was supposed to question Oswald Nov. 24, the Sunday Jack Ruby gunned down Oswald.

Wade said he shifted his attention to the Ruby trial after Oswald was killed and left the continuing investigation of the assassination ~~resting~~ up to the FBI, Secret Service and other officials.
