

2d 'JFK Plot' Arrest Foreseen

NEW ORLEANS — The chief aide to District Attorney Jim Garrison says a "second arrest" in the John F. Kennedy assassination "conspiracy" probe here "possibly" will be made this week.

William Gurvich, a private detective working for Garrison, would not elaborate.

He also said at least two persons — if not more — will be summoned today to Garrison's office for questioning.

So far five persons have been questioned by subpoena, Gurvich said.

Garrison, after a series of statements last week, has not showed up this week to talk to reporters.

Although his wife said he has taken some time off for "rest" out of town, office as-

sistants said he is working here on the investigation.

The latest person questioned is John B. Dauenhauer, a bookkeeper for the Cross Country Development Corp., which manages the International Trade Mart.

Dauenhauer, a mild-appearing man in his 50s, appeared with his attorney, F. Irvin Dymond. He formerly was assistant sales manager for the Trade Mart under Clay Shaw, the managing director who retired in 1965.
