NEW ORLEANS, MARCH 11 (AP)-NEW MOTIONS IN BEHALF OF CLAY SHAW, ACCUSED OF TAKING PART IN A CONSPIRACY TO MURDER PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, ARE EXPECTED TO BE PRESENTED MONDAY TO A THREE-JUDGE PANEL.

SHAW, A RETIRED EXECUTIVE, ARRESTED MARCH 1, IS FREE ON \$10,000 BOND. HE IS SCHEDULED TO GO BEFORE THE SAME JUDGES ON THE FOLLOWING DAY FOR A PRELIMINARY HEARING WHERE SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE MUST BE SHOWN TO JUSTIFY BRINGING HIM TO TRIAL.

SHAW'S ATTORNEYS ASKED FOR MONDAY'S SPECIAL HEARING ALONG WITH A REQUEST, ALSO GRANTED, TO PHOTOGRAPH THE APARTMENT OF DAVID W. FERRIE, A FREELANCE PILOT WHO DIED FEB. 22.

DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON, DIRECTING THE PROBE, DESCRIBED FERRIE AS A MAIN FIGURE IN THE ALLEGED NEW ORLEANS-BASED CONSPIRACY TO KILL KENNEDY. GARRISON CONTENDED FERRIE, SHAW AND LEE HARVEY OSWALD, NAMED BY THE WARREN COMMISSION AS KENNEDY'S ASSASSIN, MET AT THE APARTMENT AND DISCUSSED WAYS TO KILL THE PRESIDENT.

ATTORNEYS FOR SHAW SAID HE DID NOT KNOW FERRIE, HAD NEVER BEEN IN THE APARTMENT AND THAT THE PICTURES WERE NEEDED TO PREPARE FOR TUESDAY'S HEARING. POLICE AND GARRISON'S OFFICE ORDERED THE APARTMENT LOCKED AND SEALED AFTER FERRIE DIED. THE CORONER ATTRIBUTED FERRIE'S DEATH TO NATURAL CAUSES; GARRISON SAID HE THOUGHT IT WAS A SUICIDE.
