MP T-1 advised that there had been a reference between the two unknown subjects about the fact that there had been no regular sales meeting since Mayeraber, and he received the impression from listening to the conversation that if everything went well there would be a sales meeting at the Town House at Kellerg and Broadway in Kansas City, Missouri, on March 18, 1964.

MP T-1 also stated that he had the impression that the reservation for this sales meeting was to be in the name of a textile firm. MP T-1 advised that the last portion of the conversation that he evenheard was a statement by unknown subject Number One and was scrething to the effect that his niece had left for California and that there is more money at my or our disposal than at any other time.
