

Ohio Judge Upholds 3 Novel Affidavits

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Municipal Court Judge Bruce Jenkins overruled a motion Wednesday to cancel one of three affidavits which seek to return Gordon Novel, 29, to what he calls "Jim Garrison's Mardi Gras" investigation into the Kennedy assassination in New Orleans.

By agreement of the court and counsel all three cases were continued until July 3.

Judge Jenkins exercised a judicial power granted by state statute to extend the 30-day time limit in which Louisiana authorities should have completed extradition proceedings.

Novel was accused of outright burglary in a new affidavit filed Tuesday. The other charges accused him of conspiracy to burglarize a munitions bunker of an oil company in Houma, La. He is also wanted as a grand jury witness in the Kennedy assassination investigation.

Judge Jenkins said he felt the alleged offense is of "considerable importance and in the best interest of the public to give Louisiana authorities additional time to return the Louisiana."

The judge said it was not his duty to try the case on its merits here but he also warned: "If they (Louisiana authorities) don't do something by the end of the 60 days, they're out of business... We can't string this on forever... If they have a case, let them get on with it"

Louisiana Gov. John McKei-

then officially requested extradition of Novel about two weeks ago, but Gov. James A. Rhodes' office sent the documents back because of technical errors.

Rhodes' office reported Tuesday that no new extradition request had been received.

Novel was arrested April 1 in the Columbus suburb of Gahanna on a fugitive warrant from Louisiana.
