WITH GARRISON 270

DETROIT AP - An attorney for the brother of the late Jack Ruby Sunday branded as "completely incorrect" charges by New Orleans District Atty. Jim Garrison that Ruby was connected with Lee Harvey Oswald and New Orleans businessman Clay Shaw.

Alan Adelson, an attorney for Earl Ruby, said that Garrison told him in New Orleans last week that he had discovered a coded telephone number known to Oswald and Shaw that turned out to be Jack Ruby's phone number in Dallas.

Oswald, who was slain by Ruby before a nationwide television audience, has been identified by the Warren Commission as the assassin of the late President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw, the former director of the New Orleans Trade Center, has been charged

by Garrison with conspiracy in connection with the late President's death. He is free on \$10,000 bond.

Adelson said Garrison told him his theory of his case against Shaw.

"A lot of what he told me I can't repeat because he asked me not to. The only part that I was concerned with was when he said that Ruby, Oswald and Shaw were all working for the CIA Central Intelligence Agency," Adelson said.

Adelson said he then went to Dallas and checked out the information with people who knew Ruby.

"It is completely incorrect," Adelson said. "I don't think he Garrison has a case. If this is the kind of evidence he has, he doesn't have a case."

Adelson said he would contact Shaw's attorney's Monday and offer them his assistance. "My only concern is that Jack Ruby not be dragged into this conspiracy case," he said.

Adelson, who is not a criminal lawyer, said he had never worked directly for Jack Ruby but has represented Earl in business matters for several years.

Adelson says he is also writing a book on Ruby which he said would be "a complete defense of the Warren Commission."

"I will venture to say that I know more about Jack Ruby than anybody else in the country," Adelson added.
