Detroit (AP)_ An attorney for the late Jack Ruby asked the American and Louisiana bar associations Friday to consider disbarring New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison for "unwarranted and reckless attacks on the Warren Commission report and its members."

Sol Dann of Detroit sent letters to the bar groups urging them to intervene in all proceedings encerning the assassination of resident John F. Kennedy, expecially those Garrison is conducting.

As a result of Garrison's probe, New Orleans businessman Clay Shaw has been indicted with conspiracy tocommit the murder of Kennedy. Shaw is free on \$10,000 bond.

In New Orleans, Garrison told newsmen that Dann is "well aware of the total involvement of Jack Ruby with regard to the assassination."

"He is doing his best to block any successful inquiry," Garrison said. "This is very understandable because my objective inquiry into the murder of President Kennedy will necessarily reveal the involveme nt, not only of individuals associated with the Central Intelligence Agency, but of Jack Rubkhimself."

Ruby's brother, Earl Ruby of Detroit, has vigorously challenged Ga rison's claims that Jack Ruby was linked to any plot to bill Kennedy.

Dann became $R_{\rm u}$ by's lawyer after $R_{\rm u}$ by was convicted of killing accused presidential assassin $L_{\rm e}$ e Harvey $C_{\rm swald}$ in Dallas, Tex. The convictin later was overturned in Texas courts, and a change of venue was granted. Then $R_{\rm u}$ by died of cancer before a new trial was held.

"This request is made to put an end to any further exploitation of this horrible tragedy and to prevent a repritition of the carnival proceedings that prevailed before Judge Joe B. Brown in Dallas, Dann said. Brown presided at Ruby's trial.

His three-paragraph letter asked the bar groups not to limit their probe to Garrison, but to include investigation of any attorney involved in any proceeding related to the assassination.

Dann told newsmen this wold include judges ruling on xxxx court matters stemming from the assassination and any attorneys who have authored books about it.

 $D_{\rm ann}$ told newsmen "it wold bery much appear Mr. Garrison has improperly discharged his respnsibilties.

"His actions appear irresponsible and not in keeping with his role as prosecutor, which is to protect the innocent as well as convict the guilty," Dann said.

He said he based his claim on the fact that Garrison has challenged Warren Commission findings without "coming forward with any new evidence or new information."
