NEW ORLEANS (AP)-A CRIMINAL COURT JUDGE SAID WEDNESDAY HIS PRETRIAL GUIDELINES IMPOSED ON THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION PROBE HAVE BEEN VIOLATED--AND VIOLATORS WILL BE CITED FOR CONTEMPT WHEN CLAY L. SHAW'S TRIAL IS OVER.

"I HAVE KEPT, AND AM KEEPING, A FULL FILE OF ALL VIOLATIONS OF ORDERS ISSUED BY THIS COURT," SAID JUDGE EDWARD A. HAGGERTY. "THE CONDUCT OF SOME PERSONS HAS BEEN DEPLORABLE AND CONTEMPTUOUS OF THE COURT'S ORDERS."

THE JUDGE NAMED NO NAMES.

GUIDELINES IMPOSED BY HAGGERTY IN THE CASE OF CLAY L. SHAW, CHARGED WITH CONSPIRING TO MURDER PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, FORBADE PERSONS CONNECTED WITH THE CASE FROM MAKING PUBLIC STATEMENTS ABOUT SHAW'S INNOCENCE OR GUILT, OR ABOUT THE EVIDENCE.

DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON CONTENDS A CONSPIRACY TO KILL THE PRESIDENT ORIGINATED HERE. KENNEDY WAS ASSASSINATED IN DALLAS NOV. 22, 1963.

THE WHITE-HAIRED JUDGE MADE HIS ANNOUNCEMENT ABOUT FUTURE CONTEMPT CITATIONS AT A NEWS CONFERENCE CALLED TWO DAYS AFTER A NATIONAL BROADCASTING COMPANY TELEVISION PROGRAM SHARPLY CRITICIZED GARRISON'S PROCEDURES IN THE CASE.

JUDGE HAGGERTY SAID THE AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUSTICE, AS WELL AS SHAW, IS ON TRIAL.

NBC ACCUSED GARRISON OF USING UNRELIABLE AND UNDERHANDED METHODS IN TRYING TO BUILD UP HIS CONSPIRACY CASE.

MEANWHILE, THE CONTROVERSY AND ITS REPEATED REFERENCES TO "LIE DETECTOR TESTS" DREW A REBUKE FROM REP. JOH E. MOSS, D-CALIF. HE SAID IT ALL SERVES TO "SPREAD THE MYTH ABOUT THE VALIDITY OF 'LIE DETECTOR' TESTS."

IN A LETTER TO NBC PRESIDENT JULIAN GOODMAN, MOSS SAID A CONGRESSIONAL SUBCOMMITTEE CONCLUDED IN 1965 THAT POLYGRAPH TESTS, *commonly* CALLED LIE DETECTOR TESTS, ARE UNRELIABLE.
