Shaw is under indictment and awaiting trial for allegedly conspiring with the late David W. Ferrie and Lee Harvey Oswald to kill the late President John F. Kennedy.

Garrison charged that Shaw used the alias "Bertrand" and "Bertrand" was Andrews' identification of a man he said called him in 1963 and asked him to represent Oswald fol-lowing the death of President Kennedy at Dallas.
