A SEPTEMBER TRIAL FOR SHAW PRESSED

NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 16 (AP)-The trial of Clay Shaw, with conspiring to assassinate President Kennedy, will begin late next month if the presiding judge has his way.

Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. ordered the prosecution and defense Wednesday to finish special pleadings as soon as

possible.

"These motions have dragged on four months," Judge Haggerty said after ordering District Attorney Jim Garrison to name the West Coast city in which Mr. Garrison says Mr. Shaw furthered an assassina-

Shaw furthered an assassination conspiracy.

Judge Haggerty also directed attorney to give more information on his charges against Mr. Shaw.
