Judge Won't Quash JFK Probe in La.

NEW ORLEANS — (AP) — Clay Shaw, accused by District Attorney Jim Garrison of conspiring to assassinate President Kennedy, lost a last-ditch bid today to have the case thrown out of court.

Judge Edward Haggerty turned down two motions that would have quashed the indictment against Shaw on grounds the grand jury that indicted him was illegally formed.

The action paved the way for a trial — possibly in October — for Shaw, a 54 year old

retired New Orleans business executive. He is the only man charged so far in Garrison's controversial probe into the Kennedy assassination.

Garrison claims Shaw participated in a New Orleans-based plot in the fall of 1963 to kill Kennedy.

An Orleans Parish grand jury indicted Shaw in March on charges of conspiring with Lee Harvey Oswald, the man named by the Warren Commission as the sole assassin, and David W. Ferrie, a one-time airline pilot who died last February
