GARRISON NAMES NEW 'PLOT' FIGURE

Links Coast Man, 49, With Shaw in Assassination

NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 20— District Attorney Jim Garrison filed an information here today naming a 49-year-old man from North Hollywood, Calif., as a conspirator in a plot to assassinate President Kennedy.

The information charged that Edgar Eugene Bradley did "wilfully and unlawfully conspire with others to murder John F. Kennedy."

Last March 1, Mr. Garrison filed a similar charge against Clay L. Shaw, a 54-year-old retired New Orleans businessman. No trial date has been set in that case.

"Like Clay Shaw, Bradley's name did not come up in the Federal investigation of the assassination nor is his name mentioned anywhere in the 26 volumes of the Warren Report inquiry into the case," Mr. Garrison said in announcing the new charge, which was filed with the Orleans Parish court clerk's office.

The Warren Commission concluded that Lee Harvey Oswald was the only assassin of President Kennedy in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Plot is Charged

however, that his investigation has disclosed a plot involving right-wing and anti-Castro forces to kill the President.

Mr. Bradley was not available by phone this evening. His 19-year-old son, Brent, said he was not at home.

his father had been named as a conspirator to assassinate President Kennedy, the youth replied: "Oh really!"

He said that neither he nor his father had heard about Mr. Garrison's action in naming Mr. Bradley in an information.

The youth described his father as the "West Coast representative" of Dr. Carl McIntire, a right-wing radio broadcaster whose base is in Collingswood, N. J.

Dr. McIntire heads the 20th syndicates radio broadcasts to stations across the country. He is also the pastor of the Bible Presbyterian Church and president of the fundamentalist American Council of Christian Churches. Dr. McIntire could not be reached tonight.

Mr. Bradley's son said his mother, Connie, was a secretary

for Mattox Laboratories in North Hollywood, Calif., and that he had a sister, Jeanine, 21.

A picture released by Mr. Garrison showed Mr. Bradley to be a freckle-faced man with light hair and a dimpled chin.
