

Atsuyuki Sassa, special security agent, Japanese national police, assigned by Japanese Government, January 1964, to join FBI in its investigation of the assassination.

In Washington, 1 June 64, Sassa said that for a shot to have hit Kennedy from the front the assassin would have had to lie on the pavement ahead of the car, and his shot would have had to pierce the windshield.
