When interviewed last Friday Hall said he was at home in Monterey Park, Calif., when the President was slain. He and Mrs. Hall moved to Kernville during 1984.

During yesterday's interview Hall, who Garrison says was associated with Oswald and Jack Ruby in Dallas, reported he first saw Ruby "when I, like the rest of America, saw him shoot. Oswald on television."

Garrison, Hall said, is interested in him because he once told FBI agents he was present in the Dallas home of Mrs. Sylvia Odlo during meeting described by the Warren report as involving a person introduced to her as "Leon" Oswald.

However, Hall said yesterday he wasn't at such a meeting, but falsely told the FBI he was there because he was "frightened." AP reports.
