GARRISON SUBPOENAS WIDOW OF OSWALD

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 24
(AP) — The widow of Lee Oswald was subpoenaed for grand jury testimony today by District Attorney Jim Garrison, who doubts Warren Commission findings that Oswald alone assassinated President Kennedy.

Mr. Garrison's office issued the subpoena for Mrs. Marina Oswald Porter, now of Richardson, Tex., a Dallas suburb, to appear here Feb. 8 and 9 as part of Mr. Garrison's inquiry into the assassination.

Assistant District Attorney James L. Alcock said investigators wanted to ask her what she knew about Oswals's activities in New Orleans during the summer of 1963.

The Oswalds lived here during the summer preceding the assassination Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas. It was during this summer, Mr. Garrison maintains, that Oswald and others conspired to murder President Oswald.

BAKERSFIELD, Calif., Jan. 24 (AP) — Judge P. R. Borton rejected in Superior Court today Mr. Garrison's request that Loran Hall be returned to New Orleans to testify in the assassination inquiry.

Judge Borton said that Mr. Hall's denial that he knew any of the alleged conspirators showed that he was either not a material witness in that investigation or that he had committeed perjury.
