HEYD SAID THE DRAPES ARE A SECURITY MEASURE TO PROTECT NOT ONLY
SHAW BUT ALSO EVERYONE ELSE CONNECTED WITH THE TRIAL, INCLUDING
DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON.

GARRISON HAS SAID HIS LIFE WAS THREATENED SEVERAL TIMES SINCE THE
ASSASSINATION PROBE BECAME PUBLIC A YEAR AGO.

THE WINDOWS, WHICH ARE ABOUT 19 FEET BY 10 FEET HIGH, ARE
DIRECTLY ADJACENT TO JUDGE EDWARD A. HAGGERTY JR.'S SECTION OF COURT,
WHERE SHAW MUST BE PRESENT TUESDAY.

SHAW'S TRIAL WAS TO HAVE BEGUN TUESDAY BUT HIS LAWYERS FILED FOR A
CHANGE OF VENUE. PROCEEDINGS HAVE BEEN HELD UP PENDING A HEARING.
THE TUESDAY COURT APPEARANCE IS ROUTINE--A FORMAL REQUEST FOR A TRIAL
DELAY WHICH JUDGE HAGGERTY HAS ALREADY SAID HE WILL GRANT.
