Won't Subpena RFK, DA Tells Gov. M'Keith

District Attorney Jim Garrison has assured Gov. John J. Rouge bureau, the States-Item McKeithen that he will not emparrass U.S. Sen, Robert F. Nedhold asked McKeithen for Kennedy by attempting to subpena him while he is in New Orleans next weekend, the States-Item learned today.

The governor reportedly told Garrison: "T've never heard from that fellow (Kennedy) before, but he called me just now and asked me if I could keep you from embarrassing him by trying to subpena him when he speaks in New Orleans."

Garrison reportedly laughed and said: "When about I went to talk

and said:
"Why should I want to talk to him?"

He then assured the governor he would not embarrass Ken-nedy in any way during his visit.

YESTERDAY, assistant DA James L. Alcock said he knew of no plans by the DA's office to subpena Kennedy. Garrison was not immediately available for comment.

Kennedy said last week he supports the Warren Commission's conclusions on his brother's death. The commission said it could find no credible evidence of a conspiracy. Garrison contends that a New Orleans-based conspiracy plotted the president's death.

Garrison has subpensed, among others, former Central Intelligence Agency chief Allen

Dulles.
