LOS ANGELES AP --An extradition hearing for Edgar Eugene Bradley, accused of being involved in a conspiracy to murder President John F. Kennedy, will be held June 5 in Sacramento, Bradley's attorney said Saturday.

George Jensen, the lawyer, said he received notification of the hearing date from Gov. Reagan's legal secretary, Edwin Meese, who will preside at the hearing.

After issuing a warrant charging Bradley with conspiracy to murder, New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison is seeking the 49-year-old North Hollywood man to testify in Garrison's controversial probe of the assassination. Clay Shaw, a New Orleans civic leader, also has been charged with conspiracy to murder Kennedy.

Bradley, West Coast business executive for a broadcast evangelist, has denied any connection with the slaying. He said he was on a bus between Oklahoma City, Okla., and El Paso, Tex., the day of the killing and doesn't know Shaw.
