Laird Says He Has Power To Order Incursions in Laos

WASHINGTON, July 27 (Reuters) — Secretary of Defense Melvin R. Laird, in testimony before a House subcommittee released today, said that he felt he had authority to permit "short incursions" into Laos.

Mr. Laird's statement, made May 4 before the House subcommittee on defense appropriations, based such authority on "our protective reaction policy, to prevent American casual-ties."

He said that he had personally authorized one incursion into Laos during a visit to Vietnam.

[The New York Times reported on May 19 that Mr. Laird had disclosed in comments the previous day be-fore the disarmament subcommittee of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee that United States forces had made brief incursions into Laos on specific, limited missions.]

In the statement released to-day, Mr. Laird did not give the dates of any incursions.
