Lon Nol Begins Therapy At Army Hospital in Hawaii

HONOLULU, April 14 (Reuters)—President Lon Nol of Cambodia entered Tripler Army Medical Center here today for tests and therapy because of a stroke he suffered in 1971, hospital spokesmen said.

He arrived here last week from Phnom Penh via Bali and Guam.

The President's stroke left his left side partly paralyzed. At the time, he spent a month in the hospital here and another month recuperating at nearby Hickam Air Base.

The self-exiled Cambodian leader will remain in the hospital indefinitely, hospital authorities said.
