21 Women Seized At Army Sit-In

Twenty-one women were taken to City Prison and cited yesterday after an hour-long takeover of a U.S. Army office in the Phelan Building on Market street.

No injuries were reported in the demonstration, organized by a group called the Women's Committee for Implementation of the Paris Peace Agreement. The group was protesting U.S. policy in Vietnam.

The protest began around 2 p.m., when the women began a sit-in at the eighth-floor Army suite.

About 50 male and female protesters paraded peacefully on the street below chanting, "Implement the peace agreement; end intervention."

At around 3 p.m., members of the police Field Pa-

trol Company — the tactical squad — led the women out of the office in handcuffed pairs. The women offered no resistance.

They were taken to City Prison, cited for trespassing, and released. The women are scheduled to appear in Municipal Court May 7.

The group was demanding that all money already appropriated for the Saigon regime be sent instead to the Provisional Revolutionary Government.

They also demanded that the orphan airlift be ended, and that no U.S. soldiers be sent to aid the removal of Americans from South Vietnam.

Staff members in the Army office were not available for comment after the demonstration.
