2d Trial Is Ordered In Songmy Incident

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31-The Army announced today that it would try S. Sgt. David Mitchell on charges of assault with intent to murder 30 Vietnamese civilians in connection with the alleged massacre at Songmy last year.

The announcement of the general court-martial made this morning at the Pentagon and at Fort Hood, Tex., where the 29-year-old sergeant is stationed.

If he is convicted, Sergeant Mitchell faces a maximum penalty of confinement at hard labor for 20 years, dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of pay and reduction to private.
