

3rd Search In Chino Escape Case

Police returned yesterday for a third search of the Palo Alto home of the revolutionary charged as the triggerman in the bloody Chino prison escape of convict Ronald Wayne Beaty.

A variety of stolen goods was seized at the home of Robert A. Seabock, 23, at 616 Channing street in Palo Alto, Palo Alto police said.

Authorities said they found an extensive arsenal of weapons in two searches of the house last week. They said they went back yesterday with a new search warrant to pick up stolen goods spotted at that time.

Police said yesterday's haul included property stolen in a number of Bay Area thefts, ranging from stereo equipment to construction tools.

Seabock is one of four persons charged with killing one unarmed guard and injuring another to free Beaty on October 6 in San Bernardino county.

Based on Beaty's confession after his capture, seven other persons have been charged with harboring the escaper.

Members of Venceremos — the Bay Area revolutionaries accused of plotting the escape — insisted yesterday that only four of the 11 persons charged are currently on their semi-secret membership rolls.

But they conceded that most of the other suspects are former Venceremos members or were closely associated with the group.
