"Oswald was questioned intermittently for approximately 12 hours on November 22, and 11 a.m., on November 24. Captain Fritz of the homicide and robbery bureau did most of the questioning, but he kept no notes and there were no stenographic or tape recordings."

"Captain Fritz then asked him about the I.D. card he had in his pocket bearing such a name /A.J. Ridell/ and he flared up and stated "I've told you all I'm going to about that card. You took notes, just read them for yourself, if you want to refresh your memory."
