Kennedy's Unanimous Nomination

Amherst, Mass.

Senator Edward M. Kennedy (Dem.-Mass.) was nominated by acclamation yesterday to run for a second full term.

Kennedy, the No. 2 Democrat in the Senate, was endorsed by the state Democratic convention without opposition. He has served eight years in the Senate.

In his acceptance speech, Kennedy said he will continue to speak out against the war in South Vietnam. "For better or worse my opposition to the continuation of war in Southeast Asia is full and unqualified . . ." he said.

"I am prepared to be tested before the voters for this."

"I stand for racial harmony . . . I stand for the poor . . . and I stand for basic changes in our nation and her priorities."
