## Kennedy's Probation Ends

Edgartown, Mass.

A year's probation has been lifted on Senator Edward M. Kennedy (Dem-Mass.), who pleaded guilty to leaving the scene of an accident in which Mary Jo Kopechne died.

Miss Kpechne, a 28-year-old Washington secretary, drowned when Kennedy's car plunged off a bridge on nearby Chappaquiddick Island July 18, 1969.

Kennedy was given a

two-month suspended sentence and a one-year probation.

A letter from Mrs. Henel G. Tyra, probation officer of Dukes county, was delivered to District Court Judge Samuel M. Flaksman Saturday. It said the senator had fulfilled the terms of the probation.

The end of the probationary period will permit Kennedy to reapply for his driver's license.
