Rose Says She Can Wait

Rose Kennedy, the 80 year old matriarch of the Kennedy clan, said yesterday she was "in no hurry" to see Senator Edward M. Kennedy in the White House and neither was he.

Mrs. Kennedy said in an interview taped for showing tonight on the David Frost show, she had talked about the presidency with her only remaining son.

"Well," she said, "he assured me that he is in no hurry, as he has stated publicly, and he assured me that I would still campaign for him even though I was 90. So I'm in no hurry as far as my plans are concerned."

Mrs. Kennedy said she was "never particularly incensed" at the assassins of president John F. Kennedy and Senate Robert F. Kennedy because she believes they did not realize the meaning of their acts.

"The children (of president Kennedy) couldn't understand it, Caroline and John, why should anyone want to — but I think they (the assassins) don't know, they don't realize . . . if they did, I don't think they'd have done it," she said.
