it was a deja vu sort of thing for Senator Edward M. Kennedy yesterday when the Israeli Army helicopter in which he and his wife were riding made a forced landing on a Mediterranean beach south of Tel Aviv. This time, however. Mr. Kennedy was not serf.

The helicopter, carrying the couple from a hospital in Geneva, where the Senator inspected socialized medical care facilities, to the home of Defense Minister Moshe Dayastakook off normally, but also about 10 minutes, a radio saing light indicating engine trouble began flashing.



It later turned out there was actually nothing wrong with the first helicopter. A short circuit caused the warning light to flash. In 1964, Mr. Kennedy was not so lucky. He broke his back in the crash of a light plane.
