**Kennedy Guard Lifted****At Request of Senator**

WASHINGTON, June 9 (AP) — The Secret Service agents who have guarded Senator Edward M. Kennedy since the shooting of Gov. George C. Wallace were removed at the Senator's request this week with his thanks for their cooperation and understanding.

President Nixon ordered the protection for Mr. Kennedy and two others within an hour after the Alabama Governor was shot and wounded May 15 in Laurel, Md. At the time, Mr. Kennedy accepted the bodyguards on a temporary basis.

"He doesn't like a lot of protection around him and he especially doesn't like to have a number of agents at his house where they are visible to his children," Mr. Kennedy's press secretary, Richard Drayne, said.

Mr. Kennedy made the request in a letter delivered Monday to Treasury Secretary John B. Connally. The agents were removed that evening.
